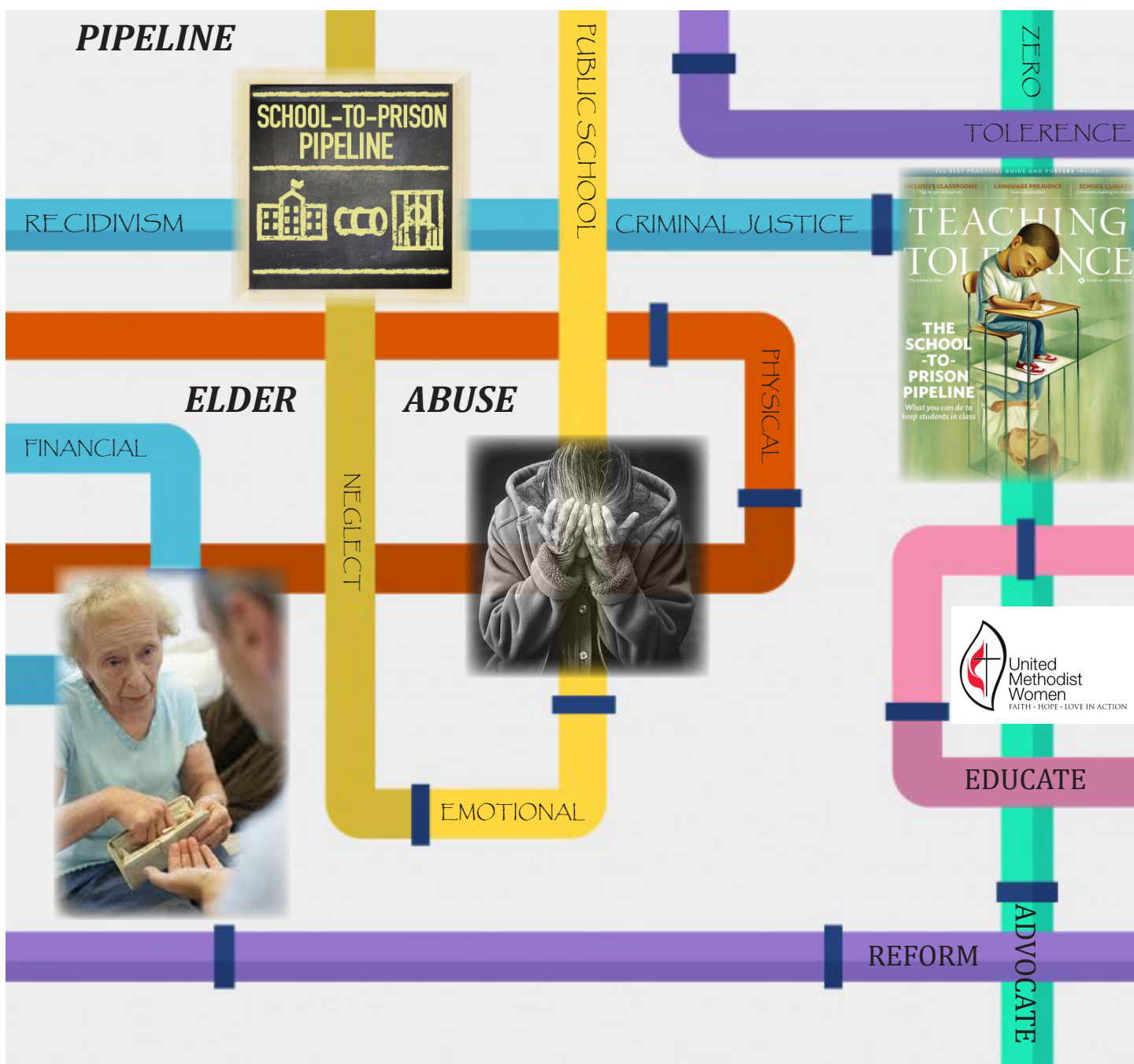

PIPELINE TO PRISON

Krystal Gourley is a 30 year old Knoxville native, daughter to Linda Minor and devout member of Martin Chapel United Methodist Church. Krystal has a strong focus on social justice initiatives that concentrate on marginalized communities of color in the Southern region of the United States, with a keen interest on the effects of gentrification, urban education, single female parent households, homelessness and incarceration. Currently she is the pianist at Martin Chapel United Methodist Church and is pursuing a Masters of Social Work from the University of Tennessee in organizational leadership focusing primarily on overseeing non-profit organizations that work exclusively with the aforementioned communities. Krystal is anticipating graduation with her Masters degree in May of 2020. She currently holds a Bachelors degree in sociology with a concentration on criminal, racial, economic and environmental justice. She is a member of the Scholarly Graduate Chapter of Phi Alpha at the University of Tennessee, the community faith based social organization S.H.A.R.E. under Martin Chapel, a member of the National Association of Social Workers, and was just invited to join the Graduate Chapter of Gamma Beta Phi National Honors Society. Krystal currently holds a 4.0 GPA at the University of Tennessee. Krystal believes that it is not the number of degrees that one person has nor the size of your bank account that matters because in the end only the things that you do for Christ will matter in eyes of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

ELDER ABUSE

Carolyn Phillips is the FTAAAD's CREVAA Advocate. Carolyn is from Alabama, and grew up as an Air Force brat, which gave her the opportunity to live all across the United States. She is married to her husband, Jim, and currently lives in Kingsport with Brittany, Remy, and three kitties. She has one son that is a Urologist doing his residency in Galveston, Texas. ELDER ABUSE

Susan J. Sheldon serves in the 4th Judicial District Attorney General's Office located in Newport. She currently serves on the Elder Abuse Sub-Committee with the Tennessee District Attorney General's Conference (TNDAGC) and works with the Committee and the Community of the 4th Judicial District in establishing new laws to protect our Elderly and Vulnerable Adults. In November 2017 the Elder Abuse Unit was created - oversees the prosecution of all Elder and Vulnerable Adult abuse cases in the 4th Judicial District. Served on the Planning Committee of the

Tennessee Elder Abuse Conference and a member of the Department of Justice's Elder Abuse Task Force. Member of the Tennessee District Attorney General Conference's Elder Abuse Committee. Member of Tennessee Vulnerable Adult Coalition (TVAC) and served as Vice Chair. TVAC is a proactive group of partners across Tennessee focused on raising awareness of the various forms of abuse committed against vulnerable and older adults. Additionally she is a member of the Tennessee Federation for the Aging and Board of Directors. At the local level, she is a member of Sevier ElderWatch, Newport ElderWatch and East Tennessee Elder Justice Coalition (ETEJC) as well as a member of their Board of Directors. Beyond the focus placed on the new laws, education and prosecution of crimes associated with Elderly and Vulnerable Adults in the 4th Judicial District, she maintains a full Circuit Court case load in Cocke County ranging from homicides to misdemeanors requiring general prosecution, non-jury and complex Jury Trials. Additional responsibilities include Grand Jury and HMVO Docket. She was recently invited to become a member of the Rural Communities Opioid Response Program for East Tennessee Consortium (RCORP-ETC) - funded by the Health Resources and Service Administration (HRSA) Award (Governed by the University of Tennessee; Director Sharon Davis). Mrs. Sheldon has served on many committees and has taught numerous classes and spoken to many groups on Elder Abuse as well as many other judicial topics.

She has four (4) children, four (4) grandchildren and two (2) nieces. Her oldest daughter, Katie Knutsen, is a Lieutenant with the Gatlinburg Fire Department and Critical Care Paramedic, worked the 2016 fires, is over Emergency Services for Gatlinburg and is an Instructor Coordinator for the state of Tennessee for Continuing Education. Her second oldest daughter, Meagan Steelman, is a BSN, RN for Laughlin Hospital located in Greeneville, Tennessee and works the Emergency Room as Charge Nurse. Both Katie and Meagan are Advanced Cardiac Life Support, Basic Life Support and Pediatric Advanced Life Support Certified. Her two (2) youngest children, Allie and Ethan are in 9th and 7th grade. It should be noted that Allie wants to be a Nurse when she "grows up," but Ethan assures me he's going to be a Prosecutor and help people. My greatest pride are my children and their endeavors to assist others as stewards to their communities.

DIRECTIONS:

Traveling from the southern and western part of conference - travel I-40 to I-81 North and continue on to Exit 57 (Johnson City) and exit onto I-26 East. Continue to Exit 13 and follow the exit that leads to Suncrest Drive under the bridge. Turn right and continue to red light, turning left and continuing approximately ½ mile where you will see an intersection and can see the church to your left behind Gray Elementary School. Turn left and then right onto Oak Street.

Traveling from the Northern and Eastern - part of the conference, from Bristol North travel I-81 south to Exit 57 and take the Johnson City Exit onto I-26 East. Continue to Exit 13 (Gray Exit) and turn right, continuing to the red light. Turn right and continue to red light, turning left and continuing approximately ½ mile where you will see an intersection and can see the church to your left behind Gray Elementary School. Turn left and then right onto Oak Street.

Traveling from Mountain City and Erwin - when you get to Johnson City, take I-26 West to Exit 13 and turn right, continuing to the red light, turning left and continuing approximately ½ mile where you will see an intersection and can see the church to your left behind Gray Elementary School. Turn left and then right onto Oak Street.
